UKRAINE VS RUSSIA.

In recent weeks, tensions between Russia and Ukraine have increased to an extent that a risk of invasion and conflict has come to a real possibility.

Putin has again claimed that Ukrainians and Russians are one people. He sees Ukrainians and Russians as brother nations and says that because Russia is the older brother, it should get to be in charge.

Most Ukrainians disagree. They have been inspired by the words of their president, Volodymyr Zelenskyy. He told Putin that Ukrainians want peace, but that if they need to, they will defend their country's independence.

Earlier this month at the Munich Security Conference the NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg said "They have all the capabilities in place, Russia, to launch an attack on Ukraine without any warning at all. No one is denying that Russia has all these forces in place,".

It is estimated that there are more than 100,000 Russian soldiers prepared a few kilometres from Ukraine, something that has been found through satellite imagery.
